OUR MAXI- GRANT WINNER – HEWLETT-WOODMERE
 Martha Ferguson - \$2500 – Peace Flags Across The Sea – This is an International Art Project. Japanese and American students will create Flags using relief printing plates and print on Japanese silk. The American and Japanese flags will be hung side by side on bamboo poles.
BOCES
 A. Guastaferrero & L. Artluck - \$285 – Queen/King for a Day – SADD students will create a database of birthdays and help students celebrate to enrich their day and improve self-esteem.
 K. Ryan, M. McElwee & T. Cohen - \$671 – Plant and Learn (PAL) – Provide horticulture experiences for middle school age students with developmental disabilities and provide them with the opportunity to share food from the plants which they grow.
